~Member Biography~ ~Barbara Hall~

I was born in a little town called Opunake in the province of Taranaki, New



Zealand. My parents were dairy farmers so we moved around a lot, until they bought their own farm that nestled under a Mountain called Egmont/Taranaki. It snowed every winter and even though it was a miserable time for the animals, we loved waking up to see the snow on the paddocks. I was a very shy and introverted child but taught myself guitar and sang within the confines of my room.

In the late 70's, I moved with my then husband

and two babies to Melbourne, for a two year working holiday - we never returned to New Zealand. Eventually, 45 towns, 55 houses, failed marriage and five children (whom I raised on my own) later, brought me to QLD and it has been my home ever since.

A midlife crisis in the early 90's took me to Jim's barn at Narangba and eventually, I plucked up courage to sing. Jim's barn was exactly that – a barn that opened up on one side, had bales to sit on and a big fire burning on the hill. I met Marianne Harth (also a sole parent) at this time and we became a duo called 'lace'. We trekked around all the country music venues with our 8 children in tow and had a ball for a few years. We travelled to Gore(NZ) with Desiree Ilona Crawford and toured the South Island, entertaining in different venues and also taught the Kiwi's how to line dance in a trio called 'Satin and lace'.

Marianne, Peter Bigg, and I (with five other people) went on to be co-founders of

Homestead Country Music in 1997 and as they say 'the rest is history'. I was the first president and to date, the current President. Homestead is near and dear to my heart and I am proud of the great club it has become. We pride ourselves on being friendly and family based and one of the very few clubs that welcome juniors.

I am very proud of my five children and the successful adults they have become. .Although my younger children sang as juniors, they soon gave it away when teenage years took over. I'm pleased that my



granddaughter April is enjoying her music and hopefully, will keep singing as she grows up. Maybe a few more grandies will follow suit in the future.

~Feature Article~ MY KIND OF MUSIC by Murray Eilola



When Bev asked me (sweetly) to write something about my favourite artists I was rather at a loss, as I don't really lean towards any particular performer when it comes to choosing songs to sing or, for that matter, to listen to. Nevertheless, when Bev asks (sweetly) for one to do something, how can one refuse? So here goes!

I didn't have a music influence in childhood. My parents didn't sing or play an instrument, we only heard music on the radio - 2MW Murwillumbah, then the stations of Brisbane when we moved to Queensland, so it was mainly pop music. There was some music in the primary school curriculum, but terrible stuff as I recall, but I did like to sing, and sixties pop and rock and roll were the go. Bill Haley, Elvis, Col Joye, Johnny O'Keefe, The Beatles, then Folk music hit the scene with Peter, Paul and Mary, The Kingston Trio, Bob Dylan and others and I was hooked! I was in my first year of teaching by then, and our favourite haunt was a folk music centre in the basement of a building in Ann Street, where they had open microphone even then. I remember singing My Old Black Billy, a duet with my girlfriend (a Sonny and Cher song) Tom Dooley, and Sounds of Silence (with a friend whom I met up with again recently, and perform with as Crosstown Country). A transfer to the country broke my link with my "folk" friends, but opened another door when I started singing with a dance band at country dances in the Lockyer Valley. This band morphed into a 7-piece outfit (lead, rhythm, and bass guitars, drums, sax, trumpet and trombone) which was quite successful. Then another transfer, marriage and career put paid to that frivolity, and apart from dabbling in school musicals and singing in church groups I lost touch with music for decades until I retired. When I expressed an interest in country music to a friend with whom I played tennis, I was invited to go to Homestead with them. and again I was hooked!

Once again, music plays a huge role in my life in retirement. My response to Bev's request is that I don't have a favourite performer, but a kind of music that I can relate to. It should tell a story that I can identify with, and can communicate to an audience with some authenticity. To that end, my repertoire contains songs by such performers as Merle Haggard, George Strait, Charlie Pride, Alan Jackson, John Denver and Ricky van Shelton and many others. I enjoy singing them, and I sincerely hope my audiences enjoy listening to them.







For the first time in a long time, the 'eyes on the stage' were a pair of sparkly blue eyes who thoroughly enjoys Homesteads concerts, delightful and cheeky grinned members and patrons and the sweet tasting beverages of Coconut Rum.

Since as long as I can remember, the audience was lucky enough to hear 2 songs from every artist, during the May concert. And what a night it turned out to be! While attendance from both artists and audience was down due to horrid weather and personal commitments, the night was a great one, with some outstanding songs from those young and.... not so young. Our junior members performed some beautiful songs covering a variety of styles. We had a beautiful acoustic cover of "The Territory" from Miss Hannah, a "tweedily deedily dee" number from the gorgeous little April and Merle Haggard's "Today, I Started Loving You Again", performed by the sweet voice of Cassi. We ended the night on a high with some rocking Elvis numbers from our own modern day Elvis (Boppa) and some harmony filled classics like "Shake Rattle and Roll" that had everyone movin' and groovin' and the crowd cheering for more. Perfect end to a great night!

Not to forget the incredible work our band does for us each month. Where would we be without them?!?!
