The Rock 'n' Roll Boys (2017 – present)

In 2017, a friend, Andrew Stokes, asked



Bob to team up with him to form the Rock 'n' Roll Boys duo. This duo worked much harder than was originally intended for the next three years at clubs and festivals around SE Qld. The duo was fortunate to be invited to such great events as the Gympie Muster, Caloundra's Beachfest and Waterhole Rocks. During 2019, young Chas Whitling joined the team to make it a trio but it wasn't long before Covid-19 enforced a lengthy layoff for the band. During this time, Andrew decided to leave the Rock n Roll Boys due to other work commitments. This made way for John Mitchell who joined the trio in 2020.

John Mitchell (lead guitar/vocals) – Originally trained in classical guitar, John's band career started in 1988 with a 50s/60s group called O'Aces. Since those days, he has played countless venues, cruises, festivals and theatres across Australia and NZ. Since 2010, John has performed in many Urban Rush tribute shows including Bee Gees, Eagles, Cliff Richard and the Shadows and ELO. He is perhaps best known for his role as rock god, Bjorn, in AbbaLive. John considers himself very lucky to have shared the stage with the likes of Phil Emmanuel, Kevin Borich, Johnny Gray, Michael Gant, Michael King, Johnny Morris and John McSweeney. Sticking closer to home these days, John is enjoying being an important part of the Rock n Roll Boys trio. His outstanding guitar skills and high harmony vocals contribute to a polished 60s sound.

Chas Whitling (piano/vocals) – Chas was originally a bass playing Science teacher around various parts of Victoria from the 60s through to the mid-90s. Around 1995, Chas set up an electronics and communication business in Bairnsdale and became a keyboard player, working as a soloist and with bands of various sizes. Chas migrated to Caboolture, Qld, in 2014 and was immediately in demand for his exceptional keyboard skills, performing with a number of duos and groups. He is now a popular member of the house band at Playitt, Woodford every Thursday night. In 2019, Chas added his keyboards and vocals to the Rock n Roll Boys. His cheery personality, top shelf piano skills and beautiful low harmonies make him an indispensable part of the Rock n Roll Boys trio. Chas has also quickly become the sex-symbol of the group - he certainly has the sexiest snow-white mini baby grand piano!

Bob Cole (lead vocals/rhythm guitar) – Bob is also a former school teacher. His music started back in Uni days playing solo and an occasional duo around the pubs and restaurants of Newcastle, NSW. After meeting and marrying Fiona, teaching took them all over Qld and the guitar became a useful tool in meeting people and making friends. Country music clubs became a focal point in places like Mackay and Moranbah and when they moved south in 1998, Homestead became the club of choice for the Cole family. Both children, Michael and Jennifer, showed interest in music and enjoyed their time at Homestead and music still plays a big part in their lives today. The Rock n Roll Boys has certainly been a welcome change of musical focus for Bob, the band's lead vocalist, over the past five years. It has been a real pleasure to play for big crowds on some great stages during that time.

Since 2017, the **Rock n Roll Boys** have played almost 300 gigs from Brisbane to Mackay. Their favourites are the big festivals and the visits to the many and varied rock and roll dance clubs across Qld that create such a great atmosphere with their beautiful outfits and enthusiastic dance moves. Who knows how long they can keep this up for, but 'the boys' are still enjoying learning and playing music and that's really all that matters. Chas (a very wise man) says "It keeps us young!"














